The circumference is not dissimilar to the Imperial Palace in Tokyo and with lots of competitive people, the fastest lunch lap time is keenly contested by employees.

The Castle at the top of Royal Mile, Edinburgh's

historical "Old Town," is also nearby and has superb views over the city. At the bottom of the Royal Mile is Holyrood Palace, the Queen's residence in Edinburgh when she comes to visit.

In the "New Town," one of the interesting things to do is look out for the signs, statues and plaques, marking where prominent people were born or lived. Search for the likes of Alexander Graham Bell (the inventor of the telephone), John Napier (who gave us logarithms) or Arthur Conan Doyle (the author of the Sherlock Holmes novels) to learn about the contribution Scots have made to the world.
